

Temple Town Hall Advisory Committee
Final Minutes, May 8, 2012

Present: Ted Petro, Dick Keuper, Ron Pulos, Dick Benotti, Connie Kieley, Sydney Thomas.

1. The Minutes of the October 24, 2012 meeting of the Committee were approved.
2. The Committee members unanimously endorsed the reappointment of Ron Pulos. Connie advised the Committee that Julie Middleton is interested in joining the Committee as the replacement for Honey Hastings, who wishes to step down. All agreed to accept Julie, if she does indeed apply for Committee membership.
3. The group unanimously voted to continue with our current officers, i.e., Connie as Chair, Ron as Vice-Chair, and Sydney as Secretary.
4. Maintenance Issues:
 - A. Although our current cleaning person, Lisa Norhrup, prefers using her own vacuum cleaner, the Committee agreed to purchase a vacuum for the Town Hall. Occasionally those using the Hall, e.g. the Drama Club, want to clean an area and a vacuum should be available to them.
 - B. Dick reported that the front hall light switch needs a cover to prevent people from using it and inadvertently altering the lighting arrangement. Dick will buy covers for that switch and also for the one in the Annex. Dick also reported that Junior Thompson will refinish the main hall floor -- he suggests that it be done sometime in the middle of the summer.
 - C. Ted and John Kieley will be doing some touchup painting on the exterior of the Hall.
 - D. Connie noted that she is concerned about the oil odor that is sometimes noticeable in the meeting room. Dick said he would check with Pinney regarding the furnace cleaning schedule.
5. The Committee explored the possibility of erecting a standing "Temple Town Hall" sign in front of the building. Connie suggested that, from such a sign, a detachable portion could be hung which would announce upcoming events in the Hall. The group generally agreed that such a sign would be awkward, and since its main purpose would be to announce upcoming events, a nice-looking sandwichboard type sign would better serve the purpose.
